I.	Introduction	Welcome & Introductions 1. Director Alfred opened the meeting and welcomed the attendees.		
II.	Public Comments	A. Community Comments 1. No public comments submitted.		
III.	Minutes	A. Review & Approval of Minutes for April 11, 2019 1. Approval tabled to June meeting due to absence of quorum.		
IV.	Director's Report	 A. Updates from the Director Alfred reported that he attended WorkCon and one of the workshops was on LinkedIn and the data analytics from that platform. Their goal is to increase their job matching service. Alfred also attended a workshop that featured ED2Go which is available for faculty. Partners are unfamiliar with the service. Louis provided contact information and MaryAnn will follow up for a presentation at a future meeting. Other workshops included a showcase of Long Beach apprenticeship where students earn credits while participating in an apprenticeship and irregular employment with an organization serving as the hub to offer insurance and benefits to these typically self-employed individuals. Alfred also shared that he and MaryAnn conducted a workshop on co-enrollment at the conference. 		



		 5. Alfred provided an update on lease of medical building property around the Garfield Campus. They are close to signing a lease with the medical center and hope to begin offering fall classes at the site. Also, GCC has purchased the property surrounding the campus and only has 2 properties left where the owners have refused offers. GCC may seek eminent domain to purchase the properties and the expansion of the campus can begin. 6. Construction may begin to expand parking. Also, Mariposa building will begin remodeling to decrease the size of some large classrooms to create additional rooms. 	
V.	Budget	 A. Update on CFAD 1. MaryAnn shared that the CFAD will need to be updated and an action item will be needed at the next meeting for members to approve the change. The COLA was reduced statewide, thereby reducing the CAEP budget by \$1M across the 71 consortia. GlendaleLEARNS is minimally affected with a reduction of approximately \$2,000. 2. MaryAnn also reported that partner MOUs for 19-20 were sent out and a few have been signed and returned. MaryAnn is still waiting on others and will be following up with partners. 	
VI.	Planning	 B. Three Year Plan 1. MaryAnn presented the results from the previous meetings which included the Mission, Vision, and Values; goals and strategies. 2. Attendees participated in small group planning activities using the results from the previous session to: a. Develop a community asset map for serving the two priority populations: individuals with disabilities and English Language Learners b. Develop a Logic Model for the goals and strategies



What's A CNC Machinist?

A CNC machinist works with computer numeric controlled (CNC) heavy machinery from setup to operation to produce parts and tools from metal, plastic or other materials. CNC equipment is machinery that cuts, grinds, or drills into the material.



Operating CNC machines requires:

- Attention to detail
- Comfort with repetitive processes
- Ability to follow clear, objective instruction
 - Excellent computer skills

Why This Job?

- 1. There is a shortage of qualified CNC machinists in the manufacturing industry.
